See Treasures From Nine Outstanding Museums At GeoFair – May 16 & May 17 At Butler County Fairgrounds

You would have to travel from Indiana to Maine to see all the breath-taking mineral and fossil specimens featured at GeoFair 2026. This year's roster of outstanding museum collections on display includes the Cincinnati Museum Center, the A.E. Seaman Museum at Michigan Tech University, Michigan's Cranbrook Institute of Science, Indiana State Museum, Miami University's Limper Geology Museum, Maine Mineral and Gem Museum, Wayne State University Geology Museum, and Wittenberg University Geology Department.

GeoFair is the Cincinnati region's largest non-profit gem, mineral, fossil & jewelry show. The 61st annual GeoFair will delight visitors over a full weekend in May.

GeoFair's theme this year is "Celebrating 250 years of America's Minerals & Fossils" so visitors will enjoy exceptional and rare specimens representing our nation's geologic history.

Admission to GeoFair is \$12 for adults and \$5 for children. (Free admission is offered to uniformed Scouts, to qualifying 4-H members, and to teachers with identification and a paid adult companion.) A two-day adult pass is available for \$18. (A coupon for \$2 off adult admission may be downloaded at www.GeoFair.Com) Admission discounts for groups larger than 10 are available. The Butler County Fairgrounds offer abundant free parking.

Since 1965, GeoFair has introduced thousands of families to the pleasures of the earth sciences including collecting minerals and fossils, making jewelry and studying geology. Experts at GeoFair will identify any fossil or mineral specimens or any items of jewelry. Dozens of displays showcase the rare "finds" of amateur collectors. GeoFair is produced by the Cincinnati Mineral Society and the Cincinnati Dry Dredgers, an association of amateur paleontologists.
